ST. BARTS

The epitome of early 2000s excess, St. Barts teemed back then with famous fans: P. Diddy and Giorgio Armani stayed at the tony Hotel Saint-Barth Isle de France (59-05-90-27-61-81; doubles, \$932-\$1,600). Snappers and rumored mega-resorts are scaring some, but there are stalwarts, Larry Gagosian and Marc Jacobs among them.





ANGUILLA

Peeps on the run from paps choose sleepy Anguilla, where the year-old Viceroy Anguilla has welcomed Sandra Bullock, Orlando Bloom, John Mayer, Derek Jeter, and Michael Jordan (264-497-7000; doubles, \$895-\$1,095); Mariah Carey housed her entourage at the ten-bedroom Le Bleu villa (264-584-8783: \$41,200 a week).



It's been the quintessential Manhattanite summer retreat for decades-from Ginger Rogers and Hedy Lamarr to S.J.P. and Michael J. Fox, who both stayed at the Village Latch Inn Hotel in the 1990s (631-283-2160; doubles, \$195-\$495), but our era of anti-flash and a planned casino are driving folks farther east on the Long Island Expressway.



Wanna share sand with Naomi Watts and Liev Schreiber? Once a fishermenonly enclave, Long Island's "End" is pulling A-listers to spots like the Surf Lodge (631-668-1562; rates unavailable at press time). Expect more when Crows Nest, from the hotelier behind N.Y.C.'s Bowery Hotel, reopens this summer (631-668-2077; rates unavailable at press time).





ACAPULCO

After Jackie Bouvier wed John F. Kennedy in 1953, she donned a pillbox hat and honeymooned in Acapulco, playground of Liz Taylor, Howard Hughes, Sinatra, and Elvis. Things are hot there now for all the wrong reasons, but if you go, we like the kitschy 1950s interiors of the Hotel Boca Chica (52-74-4482-7879; doubles, \$135-\$195).



LOS CABOS


Site of Gwyneth Paltrow and Chris Martin's honeymoon-and where Li-Lo and Samantha Ronson first sojourned-Los Cabos is a stars' cert. Find Jennifer Aniston at the swank One&Only Palmilla (52-624-146-7000; doubles, \$750-\$950); earthy Esperanza hosted Gisele and Paul McCartney (52-624-145-6400; doubles, \$788-\$1,103).



Who hasn't stayed at the Byblos Hotel? Since its 1967 inception, it's hosted Mick Jagger (he proposed to Bianca on the balcony), Princess Grace, and Jack Nicholson, who posed for photos with a young Cher. Its psychedelic subterranean nightclub, Les Caves du Roy, is still a scene (33-4-94-56-68-00; doubles, \$550-\$1,328).



Yes, there are New Rivieras (we hear ya, Croatia), but the supers aren't biting, especially with the influx of hot beds to St-Trop, including those at the spare-chic Hôtel Sezz (33-4-94-55-31-55; doubles, \$320-\$485), and the increasing popularity of mega-yachts-the preferred accommodation-meets-transportation of Beyoncé, Lady Gaga, and Kate Moss.

No one knows how to capture a scampering celeb better than paparazzo supremo Galella, best known for his photos of Jacqueline Kennedy Onassis and the young Kennedys. Apply his lessons on your next safari or whale watch . . .





"The best weather for paparazzi to shoot in is hazy sunlight, so you don't have to use a flash, draw unwanted attention, and send your subject running. For a superlative shot-whatever you're photographing-head out during sunrise or sunset."

GO CAMO "I sneak into celeb events by wearing a tuxedo. That's how I got into the premiere party for The Godfather in 1972 and snapped Ali MacGraw, Bob Evans, Al Pacino, Francis Ford Coppola, and Henry Kissinger. When I finally got caught, I was escorted to the elevator. But security looked away, and I snuck back in and made a beeline for the chow line."
